- The loss of the original cohesive overall estate design to the detriment of the street scene with particular reference to the proposed introduction of randomly varied roof lines
- The potential loss of previously agreed standards of biodiversity and effects on wildlife

Until these matters are considered and the relevant concerns addressed regarding the potential loss of the integrity of the permitted scheme, Councillors would recommend a Holding Objection.

The standards of height and illumination are ill-suited to the site which, away from the overbearing effect of A14, is characterised by rolling arable farmland within clear site of the

2 listed churches at Elmswell and at Woolpit. There are specific concerns regarding installation 22 which would seem, as proposed, to pose a threat to pedestrian safety.
