# 1 Respective responsibilities of the body and the auditor

This authority is responsible for ensuring that its financial management is adequate and effective and that it has a sound system of internal control. The authority prepares an Annual Governance and Accountability Return in accordance with *Proper Practices* which:

- summarises the accounting records for the year ended 31 March 2018; and
- confirms and provides assurance on those matters that are relevant to our duties and responsibilities as external auditors.

Our responsibility is to review Sections 1 and 2 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return in accordance with guidance issued by the National Audit Office (NAO) on behalf of the Comptroller and Auditor General (see note below). Our work **does not** constitute an audit carried out in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK & Ireland) and **does not** provide the same level of assurance that such an audit would do.

# 2 External auditor report 2017/18

Except for the matters reported below, on the basis of our review of Sections 1 and 2 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR), in our opinion the information in Sections 1 and 2 of the AGAR is in accordance with Proper Practices and no other matters have come to our attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met.

The AGAR was not accurately completed before submission for review:

- The smaller authority has not addressed the 'except for' matter raised by the external auditor when qualifying the prior year annual
  return. The smaller authority has not restated the 2016/17 figure in Box 10. Box 10 reads £462,005 but it should have been restated
  as £469,645 to agree with the loan balance according to the PWLB.
- Section 2, Box 7 for the prior year does not agree to Boxes 1+2+3-(4+5+6) and an adequate explanation has not been
  provided by the smaller authority. The figure in Box 7 should read £369,533.
- The current year accounts were prepared on a receipts and payments basis, but should have been stated on an income and expenditure
  basis as they are over the £200k threshold. Please ensure that amendments are corrected in the prior year comparatives when completing
  next year's AGAR.
